### **2018 Spending Bill Provisions**

- Fire Borrowing
- Streamlining NEPA
- Stewardship Contract Improvements
- Good Neighbor Authority Improvements
- Road Access Improvements

### Federal Forest Management Reform

### **Increased Timber Sales**

- 2018 Timber Sales: Highest Output Since 1997.
- 3.2 Billion Board Feet sold by Forest Service.
  - Goal of 3.4 BBF
  - 10% Increase over 2017
- First Time Since 1997 Selling Over 3 BBF.

### Farm Bill Reauthorization

- Covers Agriculture, Food Aid, Conservation & More
- Reauthorized Every Five Years
- 80% of Spending is on Nutrition Programs
- Less than 1% on Forest Products Industry

### Farm Bill Forest Products Programs

- Export Promotion Programs (AHEC Funding)
- Timber Innovation Act
- Community Wood Energy & Wood Innovation Program
- Forest Management Reform



### Waters of the U.S.

### Hard Data: Key to Legislative Success

- Jobs
- Gross Domestic Product (GDP)
- Labor Income
- Output
- Taxes

### Economic Impact Study-Key Findings

Impact Type	Jobs	Labor Income	GDP	Output
Direct Effect	685,450	\$34.8 Billion	\$44.7 Billion	\$135.6 Billion
Indirect Effect	509,840	\$34.7 Billion	\$54.3 Billion	\$108.9 Billion
Induced Effect	639,380	\$32.6 Billion	\$58.0 Billion	\$103.6 Billion
Total Effect	1,834,670	\$102.1 Billion	\$157.0 Billion	\$348.1 Billion

### Economic Impact Study – Key Findings

### **Exports Matter**

- Exports support 206,000 jobs
- Exports contribute \$17.8 billion to the U.S. economy
- Exports total \$39 billion in output

For every \$1 million in output of hardwood products, 5.3 jobs are supported.
